BCA Founding Officers

President (1928-1940): Harold Ober (Dauphine's Briards) - AKC Airedale & Briard judge)

Vice President (1928-1930): Wallace Macmonnies (Maxown Briards) - AKC Briard & Chow Chow judge)

Secretary/Treasurer (1928-1940): Frances Hoppin (Travailleur Briards)

All three of these BCA founders were in France 1917-18 during World War I. None were in the military. Hoppin was a Red Cross nurse; Macmonnies was in France looking after his artist uncle at the end of the war. Ober was a representative from the USA Government to study French military techniques during warfare. All met Briard War dogs and came to know a few of the prominent Briard breeders of that time. They also met each other in France.

After the war, these old connections were renewed and they imported dogs from these breeders.

Technically, Macmonnies whelped the first Briard litter in Canada. He was travelling for his work and took his very pregnant bitch, Citronelle, with him. The litter was, however registered with AKC.

Macmonnies didn't stay with Briards for long. He placed some of the pups and Citronelle with Mrs George Jacobs (Sydney Farms Briards). And with others who expressed an interest in the dogs, including then AKC President John DeMund, who named his puppy after the famous French stud dog, Jarnac, who was also the pup's great grandfather. Macmonnies two stud dogs were both Jarnac (the original one) sons. Regent de la Pommeraie was the first Briard AKC Champion. The other male, Pegasus de la Pommeraie was his half brother.

The first Briard litter born in the USA was born in 1922, bred by Mrs Barbara Danielson. Only one of the puppies was ever registered, and he was 9 years old and sired a litter, necessitating his registration. He'd been purchased by Mrs George Jacobs of Sydney Farms. She registered the dog as Timothy Jacobs.

Mrs Danielson was married to a major magazine publisher. The pushing world of the 1930's had several connections to Briards through Harold Ober. The Danielsons later came to the Obers for a new puppy. The Editor at Boys Life also had a Briard. F. Scott Fitzgerald's daughter, Scottie lived with the Obers after her parents died and spoke fondly of the Briards in her memoirs, as did her own daughter in her biography of Scottie.





FIRST RASS 1974



Rassemblement '74, the largest gathering of Briards anywhere in history, was an extraordinary learning experience. Almost 200 of these comparatively rare dogs were individually evaluated, for agreement with the breed standard, by Monsieur Jean Janicot of Saint-Just-le-Martel, France. The Briard Club of America sponsored this unique event in August, to learn more about the innumerable qualities of the breed, and to have the opinion of a respected

specialist judge from the Briard's country of origin.

The French word "rassemblement" is literally translated as a "gathering". It has come to mean a gathering of the breed for an in-depth evaluation of each dog in attendance; evaluation only against the breed standard, with no competition of one dog against another. Each dog is taken alone before the judge. The initial examination is done with the dog on lead and then the dog is allowed to run freely in the

ring, off lead, so his natural attitude and movement can be evaluated. A critique is written for each dog, and an over-all evaluation of the breed is made by the judge at the end of the event.

Rassemblements are held regularly throughout Europe, by various breed clubs. They have been held in France for Briards, by the Club des Amis du Briard, since 1970. A number of American Briarders had the privilege to observe the French evaluations and felt that a similar experience would be invaluable here in the United States. The Briard Club of America, with an approximate membership of 250, received the idea enthusiastically. Any initial hesitation over expenses and procedures gave way to support on all levels, with the membership raising the necessary funds and their expectations in equal proportions.

To ensure the largest participation, two sites were chosen, one at the Hospitality Motor Inn, Columbus, Ohio and the other at the Carmel Valley Inn, Carmel, California, one week later. It was decided to open the event to all Briard owners, club members and non-members alike. Even pet quality dogs were encouraged to participate so that entire breeding programs could be analyzed, as well as the individual dogs.

Two years were allowed for planning. The interest, cooperation and contributions of each member of this small club were required in order to make this ambitious undertaking succeed. Surveys were made to locate non-member Briard owners, and as the word spread, even those not affiliated with the Club volunteered their support. Possible

sites were studied, and the mechanics of the event were planned. Details as to where the judge would stay during a month as our guest, how and where he would travel, and interpreters had to be arranged. Every effort was made to be sure that Briarders and other dog fanciers would be welcome again, with their dogs, at the respective motel sites.

Monsieur Janicot's acceptance of the invitation to judge became the welcomed point of no return. One of the foremost authorities on the Briard today, M. Janicot has been involved with the Briard since birth. He became a breeder about 1948 and his knowledge of breeding became apparent in the consistent quality of the Briards he produced. Under the urging and tutelage of the noted breed authority, Monsieur Robert Montenot, he became a Briard specialty judge (a process which takes several years of study) and today is licensed to judge more than 40 breeds. Active in many breed clubs, he is a breeder's consultant, an international judge and is a Vice-President of the Societe Central Canine (French equivalent of the AKC).

Americans awaited this knowledgeable man with natural trepidations. He had judged Briards throughout Europe, at all French Rassemblements and would now evaluate the Briard in America. We secretly wondered if our dogs would measure up to his high standards. However, from the moment of M. Janicot's arrival with his charming wife, we were put at our ease. Their good humor and enthusiasm erased all concern and it seemed as though we had become the Janicots' guests in our own country.

They took time changes in stride, seeing as much as they could of the American way of life. They traveled from east

to west and back again, via car, plane, motels, members' homes and dinner tables, truck stops and gourmet restaurants, an AKC dog show and even Disneyland. They sampled our seafood, hamburgers and hot dogs, American wines, Mexican food, and had to try peanut butter sandwiches. Although most of their conversation was through two interpreters, the Janicots managed to outlast and charm us all.

Briards came from as far south as Louisiana and as far north as Ontario, representing 23 states and Canada. One young dog, which entered the United States as "household goods" had traveled all the way from Italy to Carmel, California for evaluation. Many more Briards were registered in Ohio than had been anticipated. Since the dogs were to be evaluated one at a time, allowing 8 to 10 minutes per dog, a third day of judging had to be arranged at Columbus. Still, M. Janicot took time from his schedule to informally evaluate any puppies, who were under the required minimum age for the event. By the end of the first Rassemblement weekend in Ohio, M. Janicot had evaluated 145 Briards, almost 50% more than had ever been together before.

At the two Rassemblement sites, procedures were the same. Owners were provided with a printed evaluation sheet for each dog and an identifying armband. The dog was photographed and measured (in centimeters) and then proceeded to the evaluation ring. The atmosphere was relaxed and informal for all participants. Once in the ring, the Briard stood before M. Janicot, whose ensuing comments were translated, point by point, and repeated over the public address system for the audience. The European grading system of "excellent, very good, good, or fair" was used as he evaluated every detail from the color and wisdom of each eye to the degree of crochet in every tail. He finished with his over-all evaluation of the dog as a whole. Madame Janicot recorded his comments on the evaluation sheet, which was then signed by the judge and translated into English for the owner.

Any questions asked were answered, occasionally with humor. "No, this dog's tongue is not too long," the judge replied to one concerned owner, whose companion refused to close his mouth. "It is merely that the head is not long enough to contain it."

As M. Janicot found a particularly interesting quality, observers were urged to examine the characteristic. One pup, with an excellent coat was kept at ringside for quite some time so everyone could feel the texture of the dog's "goat's coat". Another Briard had turned from black to what M. Janicot said was a true grey, and when he saw one typey bitch, he commented, "I would like to take this one home with me."

With each comment and each successive dog, waiting owners became more anxious for evaluation of their dogs. Ringsiders pressed closer and asked for more and more information. There has always been a general failing among doggy folk — an uncanny ability to seize upon a fault and completely overlook the rest of the dog — but here, faults fell into perspective as they were offset by the positive qualities of the dog. We quickly realized that this detailed look at the dogs, and the tactful manner in which it was done, was giving us an exciting new vantage from which to view our Briards.

Quite different from the usual dog show, there was no stacking. Gaiting was done at a walk, then a trot, always on a loose lead. Finally, off lead, each dog was allowed to move naturally in the ring in order to assess his natural attitude, and that all important "allure berger", which is the combination of the movement and demeanor of the shepherd dog.

After all the dogs at each location were evaluated, M. Janicot spent hours answering questions, both general and specific regarding breeding, diet, exercise and pedigrees. He commented that he was impressed with the excellent sportsmanship of the participants. When asked the most important asset for a Briard, he replied that type was probably the most important, but that good angulations and coat texture are also very important. Repeatedly stressing the utility and physical requirements of this working breed, he said that good angulations enable the dog to work better and the coat must be good to protect him from the elements. He said that in general, the Briards he had seen were as good as those in France but that they seemed more lively and not as sharp as their French relatives. These informal sessions were extremely informative and a fitting conclusion to an unusual event.

Owners were given the evaluation sheets as souvenirs of the remarkable adventure. A copy of each evaluation, together with a photo of the dog, will be published in French with English translation, in a final report catalog, to preserve M. Janicot's remarks for those interested in the quality and character of the Briard, as it was viewed in 1974.

M. Janicot completed his work with comments on the Briard in America and the following conclusion. "I have judged your Rassemblement with much severity, in the interest of the Briard. We are happy to see in America, very beautiful dogs, very close to the standard. I wish with all my heart that you will succeed, because you merit success. I do not want to close without thanking all the people who received us and let us visit your marvelous country. Thank you for everything, bravo to you all, and long live American Briards."

Thank you, Monsieur.

Foundation Briards

The pedigrees that follow are those of the French imports that founded the Briard in America. The dogs names in bold print on the list of earliest AKC registered Briards are included in these pages. Some of those from the list not included either were never bred, or their few offspring/grandoffspring lineage ceased to continue. There are still Briards in America today who can trace their ancestry to one or more of these dogs. Later imports from the 1960s and beyond have decreased the number of dogs descended from these foundation dogs.


Yet, remarkably, from modern times, the recent winners of the BCA Nationals from 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018 can all trace their lineage to the first Briard registered with AKC, Daulphine de Montjoye, via varying number of generations or individual dogs, they all go back to the very beginning of Briards in the USA.

It is interesting to note that in Briards, unlike several other breeds introduced to America, the Briard hasn't suffered from "founder syndrome". This unpleasant effect has come about when a new breed began to be established, but only had a small number of individuls to work from. The Briard, essentially had 10 founding dogs originally, yet was spared the horrible health effects related to the unhealthy small numbers gene pool could cause. Considering too, that several of these foundation dogs were closely related on one single French dog makes this even more notable. Briards indeed did 'luck-out' in having genetically healthy individual foundation dogs.






