ISC WORLD TEAM QUALIFYER EVENT

For 2018 the American Kennel Club (AKC) will field a team of 12 dogs to compete at the FCI Agility World Championships (AWC) which will be held in Kristianstad, Switzerland on October 4-7, 2018.

- Three dog/handler teams from each height division will win a spot on the team at AKC WTT. The remaining team member(s) will be chosen by the Coach and Team Leader based upon scores from AKC WTT as well as Major ISC classes, all classes at AKC Nationals, and the team's competition results at regular competitions. All information provided to the Coach will be considered in choosing the remaining team.
- It is not a requirement to attend AKC Nationals or to enter ISC at Nationals or to enter 26 inches for large dogs at that event.
- These dogs will be sponsored by the AKC.

Basic Eligibility for all candidates entering World Team Tryouts

- A "Team" shall be considered, for purpose of these rules, to be an owner/handler or a co-owner/handler and a dog which meets requirements for height and pedigree.
- A "Candidate" is the owner or co-owner handler that intends to compete for a position on the 2018 AKC Agility World Team.
- Any Candidate younger than 18 years of age at AKC WTT must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at their own expense (e.g.: air, hotel & ground travel) at the AKC WTT competition and AWC competition as well as team practices, should the minor become an AKC AWC Team member.
- The Candidate showing the dog at AKC WTT will be the only handler allowed to compete with the dog at the AWC competition.
- The handler of the dog at AKC WTT must be the handler who showed the dog to gain its minimum score or title requirements.
- Candidates must be the registered owner or co-owner of record of the dog at entry closing time for AKC WTT.
- Candidate must be willing to travel with the team to the AWC.
- Dogs must have a three generation pedigree showing three generations of purebred lineage. (This is a requirement of the FCI Agility World Championships, not the AKC.)
- The FCI requires that every dog have an AKC registration number and acceptable FCI recognized pedigree.
- Dogs with cropped ears will not be allowed to compete at the FCI World Championship in Kristianstad, Switzerland, 2018. Dogs with docked tails will be allowed to compete.
- Team members must attend the two Team practices, arrive in Kristland by the Monday night prior to the event and attend all the practices in Europe prior to the AWC.
- Candidate must be willing to acquire any documentation required by the local government(s).
- Team Members must be willing to have their dog treated for tapeworm within 30 days of the competition if the host country requires it. Team Members must be willing to vaccinate their dog for rabies no more than one year prior, but also no less than one month prior to the date of the competition.
- Please note that it is important that your dog's microchip and/or tattoo numbers be on your rabies certificates. You will likely need to ask your vet to manually add this information and sign it as it is not common practice to include it. ISO compatible microchips are the only ones recognized in Europe.
- Candidates must be in good standing with the American Kennel Club. Any Candidate who has received a misconduct charge during the year prior to tryouts will not be allowed to compete at AKC WTT. Any handler who receives a misconduct charge after earning a spot on either team, and before the competition, may also be subject to sanction up to and including removal from the team by the Team Coach and AKC Director of Agility.
- Candidates must at all times demonstrate extreme Good Sportsmanship while participating in or watching any agility event. The Team Coach & AKC Director of Agility may refuse entry to AKC WTT and/or the AWC team to any handler who demonstrates verbal or physical abuse to a dog or fellow competitor or acts abusive or challenging to an agility judge.
- Candidates are representatives of the agility program in the United States and are also representing those companies which sponsor agility in the United States.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

Small -12 inches - for dogs 13-3/4" and under at the shoulder

Medium -16 inches - for dogs 16-7/8" and under at the shoulder

Large - 24 inches - for dogs over 16-7/8" at the shoulder

All small and medium dogs competing at Tryouts will be measured by the Agility Director. Due to stricter measuring procedures at the FCI competitions, dogs within 1" of the cutoff should be prepared to also be measured by both judges of record at the Tryouts. Dogs measuring over will run FEO (for exhibition only) at the jump height entered. Dogs who have "measured in" at the AWC prior years do not need to be measured at AKC WTT. An official FCI wicket using 35cm and 43cm will be used at Tryouts to determine the dog's height.

Please consult the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for a complete description and eligibility for entry into these classes. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated. All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the Regulations for Agility Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website at <http://www.akc.org/rules/>

AFTER CLOSING WAIT LIST

After the closing date, BCA is offering a Wait List to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after closing. A maximum of 25 entries will be placed on the wait list. All entries including wait listed entries must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to September 13, 2017, 6 pm. Any entries withdrawn prior to September 24, 2017 at 5 PM, will be replaced by a wait list entry when available, a full refund will be given to withdrawn entries when wait listed entries are available to replace the pulled entry. Any wait list entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial by September 24, 2017 5 PM will receive a full refund. If a dog is pulled but cannot be replaced, the exhibitor will not receive a refund and the dog will be considered absent for the trials.

OBSTACLES

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the *Regulations for Agility Trials*. All classes will take place indoors on a sport turf surface. Ring sizes will be 130 x 100'

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION & TIMING

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request with judge's approval, to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog. Umbrellas are not allowed on the course during the walk thru. Electronic timing devices may be used.

MOVE UPS AND CLASS CHANGES

From Chapter 1, Section 20: Move-Up entries will be accepted for dogs that have completed a title after the closing date. Email notification of move up or class change is acceptable, with return receipt verification from the secretary. Either Move Up forms or emails must be completed and delivered to the Trial Secretary prior to 6 PM on the Monday evening preceding the event. Move-up entries for Saturday or Sunday must be delivered to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the conclusion of judging of the class they are moving up from. Dogs so moved up will run at the end of the running order. Move-ups can only be accepted if judging limits are not exceeded.

Entry move-up valid only if the dog was already entered in the Event indicated and only if approved by the Trial Secretary. Dogs moved up will run at the end of the class running order.

Effective February 1, 2017

Regulations for Agility Trials: Chapter 1, Section 21. Change of Entry. In addition to Move-ups as described in Chapter 1, Section 20 entries may also be changed as noted in this section. A dog which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler may be moved to the Novice "B" class under the following conditions:

The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice "A" class to the Novice "B" class.

After the close of entries a dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.

If a VMO or Field Representative at a trial measures a dog into a height other than what they entered, the entry may be changed from Regular to Preferred or from Preferred to Regular, as long as the dog has not run any classes that day. If the dog has already run, the change may be made for the next trial day(s). The exhibitor must provide the Trial Secretary the AKC Agility Measurement Form when requesting the class change.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog *before* its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

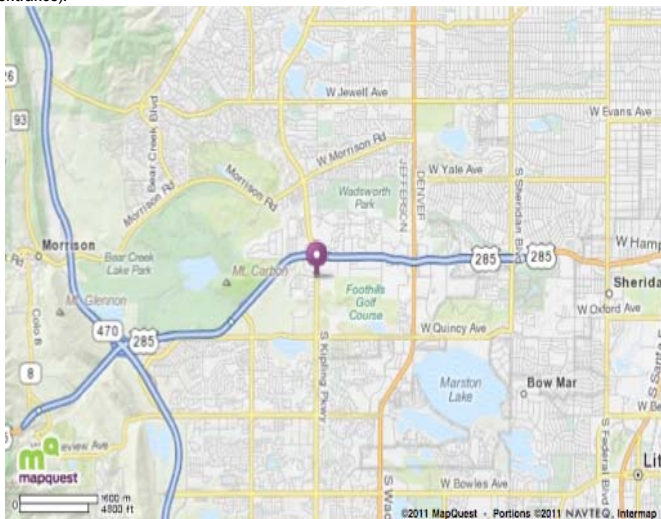

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The BCA and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The BCA reserve the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against BCA or any official thereof.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course. All regulations governing the use of this facility, and all regulations and decisions of the trial committee at this trial will be strictly enforced, including and not limited to the recorded information of this premium list.

Puppies under 4 months of age are prohibited at AKC Agility Trials.

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.

ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number (in trials offering mixed breed entries), or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number (in trials allowing mixed breed entries) must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in AKC Agility Trials. The Club will issue a full refund for the trial entries, providing a Veterinarian examination report is provided to the Secretary at least 30 min prior to the start of the trial day.

Chapter 1, Section 9 of the [Regulations for Agility Trials](http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf), <http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf>, states, "Females in season must be fully refunded if withdrawn by the Trial Secretary after closing and no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. The club may retain a processing fee and must publish this information in the premium (no fee is paid to the American Kennel Club for females in season who are withdrawn)."

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging, if a valid copy of their jump height card was sent with their entry. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Exhibitors may bring their own chairs and tenting for shade.

CRATING and SEATING

Crating areas will be available at the show grounds but space is not guaranteed. Exhibitors will be required to lay a WATERPROOF tarp or mat under their crating space to minimize spills, food particles, and dog hair getting into the turf. If these conditions are not met, or if a set up is taking space from other competitor's ability to set up, the Show Site Committee reserves the right to alter crating arrangements for space, safety or site requirements. Seating is allowed on the field. Exhibitors are responsible for the conditions in and around their space. No dogs will be permitted to stay overnight at the show site. A reserved crating area will be provided for trial workers. X-pens allowed for 2 or more dogs per pen.

FOOD IN THE ARENA

Most food, beverages, and dog treats will be allowed in the crating area which must be covered by a WATERPROOF tarp or mat. Take extra care to clean up spills or food particles as these attract insects and vermin into the arena. No sunflower seeds or gum permitted. Spitting is expressly forbidden and will incur a \$100 fine issued by Foothills Parks & Recreation District managers.

If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Move-up entries for Saturday or Sunday must be delivered to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the conclusion of judging of the class they are moving up from. Dogs so moved up will run at the end of the running order. Move-ups can only be accepted if judging limits are not exceeded.

Entry move-up valid only if the dog was already entered in the Event indicated and only if approved by the Trial Secretary. Dogs moved up will run at the end of the class running order.

Regulations for Agility Trials: Chapter 1, Section 21. Change of Entry. In addition to Move-ups as described in Chapter 1, Section 20 entries may also be changed as noted in this section. A dog which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler may be moved to the Novice "B" class under the following conditions:

The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice "A" class to the Novice "B" class.

After the close of entries a dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.

If a VMO or Field Representative at a trial measures a dog into a height other than what they entered, the entry may be changed from Regular to Preferred or from Preferred to Regular, as long as the dog has not run any classes that day. If the dog has already run, the change may be made for the next trial day(s). The exhibitor must provide the Trial Secretary the AKC Agility Measurement Form when requesting the class change.
